Faculty: Submit no more than 5 images from your current students' work that best showcase your school to the entire conference and on SNAG's youtube channel.

Deadline: Midnight, Pacific Standard Time, April 6th, 2017

Faculty Submissions

All submissions for this presentation must come from faculty, not from the individual students. This presentation is not juried. The five images submitted will be included in the presentation. However, depending on the number of schools participating, SNAG may need to edit for time. Every effort will be made to give equal representation to each participating institution.

If your program has multiple faculty, please coordinate your selections with each other. We will accept only one set of images from each school. If multiple submissions are made from one school, we will do our best to contact you and correct the error. The submission process for this presentation no longer overlaps with the juried student exhibition.

Intro Image

Please submit an image to represent your program for your school's title slide. This can be either a humorous or serious image of faculty and/or students, an image of your facilities, or of your institution. Please submit this image at the same time and in the same format as your student images and label it with your school name only (e.g. Yale.jpg).

Eligibility

All students under the direction of faculty in any degree, diploma or certificate-granting institution are eligible. Select work from **current** students only. Work must have been created between January 2016 and February 2017. Artworks included in previous SNAG student exhibitions and/or created before 2016 are not eligible. SNAG membership is not required for participation, though membership is always encouraged!

Submission Requirements

- One image per student, maximum of **5** students
- File name **must** be as follows: school_artist's last name _title.jpg
For example: ECU_Massey_ring.jpg
- Images must be oriented properly and will not be manipulated by the organizers
- Each image must accurately reflect the work submitted.
- Each entry must indicate the level of the student (e.g. MFA candidate, BFA candidate, etc)

Submission Instructions

- Digital images may be emailed to StudentPresentation@snagmetalsmith.org
- **In the body of the email, please list each student's name, title of piece, year created, materials and processes, as well as the level of the student (BFA, MFA, etc)**
- Also in the body of the email, provide the name of your institution and list all the metals faculty from your institution

Image and Media Preparation

Image Specifications

All images **must** be formatted to the following specifications in order to upload them successfully into the system. If your images do not conform to these specifications, we will make every effort to email you to let you know and it is ultimately the faculty's responsibility to re-submit images that adhere to the following guidelines.

Dimensions: 1920 pixels on the longest side

1. **File Format:** Save all images as BASELINE Standard JPEG. **Do not save as a Progressive JPEG.**
2. **File Size:** JPEGs should be under 2 MB.
3. **Color space:** Save images in an RGB color space.

NOTE: The organizers will **NOT** adjust, reformat, reorient or fix images that are submitted incorrectly... please, double check your images before submitting.

Video submissions will be included. Videos must be no longer than 7 seconds. **Please send either Avi, mov. or Mpeg files.**
